Three years ago we became a fund raising site for "Wreaths Across America" that year we funded 30 something wreaths (we got a late start), last year we funded 69 wreaths (significant improvement), This year we funded 85 (terrific improvement). We were not alone in having a fantastic improvement, last year there were approximately 7,500 wreaths placed at the Saratoga National Cemetery. This year there was more than enough wreaths for one/grave!

The entire Capital District really stepped up; there were at least 4 times as many people in attendance for the placement this year than there were last year. GUEST SPEAKER: Albany County Sheriff, Craig D. Apple, Sr.

Sheriff Apple will talk about two programs he instituted. The first program aims to rehabilitate veterans who find themselves in trouble. This program has reduced the recidivism rate for these veterans from the average of over 40% to less than 10%. The second program targets the opioid epidemic. He may also speak about the "Soldier On" housing program for homeless vets, which includes redoing the now vacant Ann Lee Nursing Home and adding two 100-room additions next year. Our hope is that our Albany County members will support these efforts, and members in other counties will urge their sheriffs to do similar things.

MOAA'S TOP 10 LEGISLATIVE GOALS FOR 2018

As a member of an advocacy organization it is never too late (or too often) to contact your legislators concerning MOAA's goals for this year. These goals were listed and explained in the January issue of the Military Officer magazine and bear repeating. *For your convenience, these goals are presented here in an abbreviated fashion.* They are:

- 1. Ensure any TRICARE reform sustains access to top quality care;
- 2. Prevent disproportional TRICARE fee increases;
- 3. Sustain military pay comparability with the private sector;
- 4. Block erosion of compensation and non-pay and quality of life issues;
- 5. Protect military retirement and COLAs;
- 6. Sustain wounded warrior programs and expand caregiver support;
- 7. End financial penalties to survivors and the disabled;
- 8. Ensure the Guard and Reserve system adequately supports the requirement for an operational reserve;
- 9. Ensure spouse and family support programs are aligned with current and emerging needs of an all-volunteer force; and
- 10. Ensure timely access to VA health care and preserve earned veterans' benefits.

As of January 1, 2018, most TRICARE Prime enrollees no longer need a referral for urgent care visits and point-of-service charges no longer apply for urgent care claims. This change replaces the previous policy, which waived referrals for the first two urgent care visits per year.


