HIGHLIGHTED CHARITY for this edition → GUARDIAN HOUSE

The GUARDIAN HOUSE, 1214 Saratoga Road, Ballston Spa, provides transitional living quarters for around 13 homeless female vets in Saratoga County. It has been in operation since 2008. Similarly, the Vet House of Saratoga County, 36 Church Ave, Ballston Spa, provides transitional living quarters for a dozen homeless male veterans. It has been in operation since 1983. Both facilities offer camaraderie and peer-to-peer support for at-risk veterans.

How can we help? Those coming to our April 8 meeting may bring items such as <u>dish soap</u>, <u>dishwasher soap</u>, <u>paper towels</u>, <u>laundry soap</u>, <u>or toilet paper</u>. Chris Costigan will collect all donated items and deliver them to both the houses. *If you want to help but can't get to the April meeting*, or if you have questions about these services, you may contact Chris at 518-884-2943. CHAPTER NEWS & OTHER EVENTS

- **Chapter funds** are being squeezed by operating costs and our support of worthy causes. If we want the Chapter to continue to "make a difference", we need to raise revenues. One option is to raise annual dues from the very modest \$15 to something more substantial. The question is: *How much?* Think about this, because we will be surveying members later this year.
- At our last meeting on February 11, *Albany County Sheriff, Craig D. Apple, Sr.* wowed members with a riveting description of two highly successful programs he instituted at the County correctional facility: one rehabilitates veterans with problems; the other, opioid addicts. Both programs aim to end the "revolving door" of repeat offenders who return to old habits after serving time and end up back in jail. Sheriff Apple has been working hard to wean people off self-destructive criminal behavior so they can resume productive lives.
- On Friday, March 2, despite the snowstorm, <u>nine</u> attendees represented our Chapter at STRIDE'S 13th Annual Snowfest Welcome Ceremony for "wounded warriors" at the Hilton Garden Inn in Troy. (Unfortunately, the Leukhardts, who made a *very generous donation* to the Snowfest, were not able to make the welcome banquet.) The ceremony kicked off a weekend of snow sport activities at Jiminy Peak for severely wounded and injured veterans and their families to help them regain confidence to cope with life, despite physical or psychological limitations. - The Leather Stocking Honor Flights will be having their first flight dedicated to Vietnam vets. It will be on <u>21 April</u>. It is their first flight, three more to follow. Anyone interested can apply at their website, <u>www.leatherstockinghonorflight.org</u>.

We have been told by Ben Margolius that it is a big help to those who do MOAA's "Storming the Hill" if the elected officials are at least aware of MOAA's issues for the year prior to the arrival of the "Storming" people. The committee members are striving to accomplish that goal. On 5 March, Chris Costigan and Skip Bebernitz (Pat Piccirilli is recovering from surgery) met with Colleen Williams of

Congressman Tonko's office. She was very attentative and receptive to the top 10 list of MOAA's agenda for this year.

They have gone to the website for Congressman Faso and Congresswoman Stefanik to request a similar meeting and are awaiting notification from those offices. CHAPTER MEMBER SERVICE PROPOSAL

Medications from the Naval Dispensary in Saratoga Springs are *so much cheaper* than VA, XPress Scripts or the neighborhood pharmacy. So, Chapter member *Harry Brockman* presented this proposal to the Board of Directors:

- <u>The Problem</u>: As Military Retirees age, we lose mobility and/or transportation to access the Naval Dispensary in Saratoga Springs. Fortunately, the Navy allows a proxy to pick up retiree prescriptions by presenting a written authorization and a copy of the retiree's Military Identification Card. However, the proxy would need his or her own military ID card to access to the Naval Dispensary, and few retirees know someone nearby who has a military ID.
- **<u>Proposed Solution</u>**: Since every MOAA member and spouse has a valid military ID card, our Chapter should form a committee of volunteers to set up a program for pick-up and delivery of medical prescriptions for other members and retirees unable to drive to Saratoga Springs.
- <u>Concept of Operations</u>: To lighten the load on individuals, the committee could set up rotating assignments among volunteers. Assignments might include: (1) determining medical/pharmacy deadlines and documentation needed by proxies; (2) receiving calls for assistance and contacting drivers (proxies); (3) pick-up and delivery service, and (4) invoicing/collecting mileage reimbursement owed by recipients.
- <u>Considerations</u>: Recipients of the delivery service should expect to reimburse volunteer Committee members for mileage costs. Consider that our "Tricare-for-L ife" benefits do not require co-payment, but recipients are expected to ensure that medical providers transmit the prescriptions to the Dispensary and order the prescribed refills.
