## JUNIOR RESERVE OFFICERS' TRAINING CORPS



The following information was gleaned from the military services' JROTC web pages: The National Defense Act of 1916 established organized JROTC programs at public and private educational institutions. In 1964, Congress expanded the program to all military services and relieved the active duty components from sole responsibility, sharing support between the services and schools. As congressionally mandated by Title 10 United States Code, Section 2031, each military service must have a JROTC program, not to train youth for war, but to "instill in students in United States secondary educational institutions the values of citizenship, service to the United States, and personal responsibility and a sense of accomplishment."

MOAA makes available to local chapters a disctinctive medal with accompanying certificate exclusively for the recognition of outstanding JROTC cadets in their next-to-last year in the program. All military services officially have approved the medal for presentation. MOAA views JROTC awards as "an excellent way for chapters to gain exposure in their community and, at the same time, foster a positive military recognition among the youth of the community." Consequently, MOAA insists that local chapters and not the national organization present the awards. The program is entirely voluntary; chapters are not obligated to give awards. No more than one award may be presented each year in any one JROTC unit; no individual is eligible to receive the award more than once. The JROTC unit commander selects the recipient and arranges the presentation in coordination with the local MOAA chapter. (Continued on Page 2)

To be eligible for an award, a JROTC candidate must:

- be in the next-to-last year of a JROTC program;
- be in good academic standing;
- be of high moral character;
- demonstrate a high degree of loyalty to the unit, school, and country; and
- demonstrate exceptional potential for military leadership.

Eligibility requirements for *Marine Corps JROTC* are a little different. A MCJROTC candidate must:

• be in the upper 10 percent of his or her high school class;

where our Chapter presented MOAA JROTC medals and certificates to

- have an A average in MCJROTC academic subjects;
- be assigned to a cadet "officer" billet; and
- be nominated in the junior year.

Our chapter has participated in JROTC (and ROTC) awards for a long time. This year, we presented awards to outstanding cadets at *four* local high schools. Here are some highlights from the JROTC awards ceremonies at four local high schools

deserving young cadets:

Christian Brothers Academy (CBA) of Albany (Army JROTC). Al Memole and Skip Bebernitz attended the annual CBA JROTC Leadership Awards Night on May 2 to present the MOAA JROTC medal to Cadet GAVIN PISKUTZ (at right holding his MOAA medal and certificate after the ceremonies with Al Memole). Gavin's top favorite academic subject is Math. He is interested in military service in legal afairs.





Amsterdam High School (MCJROTC). Al Memole attended the annual Marine Corps JROTC Awards Ceremony on May 15. Retired Marine Colonel and Chapter member (and NYS Assembly Rep) *Bob Smullen* also attended after a late-running legislative session in Albany. ### RIP THOMAS W. LENAHAN, Captain, USAF (Ret.)



The saddest news to report is the loss of one of our own – our dear friend and comrade, Tom Lenahan. He was 78 years old when he passed away on July 21, 2019 in The Villages, Florida, after a brief illness. Following his wake and funeral at St. Edward the Confessor Church, Clifton Park, Tom was buried with full military honors at the Gerald BH Solomon Saratoga National Cemetery in Schuylerville. Tom was



predeceased by his first wife Nancy, and is survived by his loving bride, Valerie Prescott, his five children, three brothers and their wives, 9 grandchildren, 6 great grandchildren, and several nieces and nephews.

Tom was born in Schenectady, graduated from Catholic Central HS, Troy, in 1958, earned his bachelors degree from Michigan State and a masters and ABD from SUNY Albany. He served from 1960-1982 with the US Air force, retiring as a Captain. He also retired as Professor of Criminal Justice from Herkimer County Community College, Herkimer, NY. Tom was an ever cheerful and energetic member of our Board of Directors. He is famous among the MOAA Chapters across the state as THE consummate hospitality suite host at Council of Chapters conventions. We will miss his outgoing and engaging personality. Tom not only served MOAA, our Chapter and the Chapter in The Villages, he also volunteered for many years with the VA Hospital in Albany, the Solomon National Cemetery Honor Guard, The Villages Honor Flight Team, and other military and civic organizations.
