organization's efforts to help veterans suffering physically or psychologically "to learn how to overcome the challenges of injury and enjoy independence and freedom through sport." Each year STRIDE invites veterans with wounds, severe injuries, or PTSD to enjoy a weekend of skiing, snowboarding and activities with their families at Jiminy Peak Mountain Resort, Hancock, MA. Twenty WW are expected to be honored this year.

The biggest fundraiser for this expensive event is the annual Snowfest Welcome Ceremony and banquet. This year's ceremony takes place on **Friday, March 6, from 6:00 pm to 10:00 pm at the Hilton Garden Inn in Troy**. It is a first-class event replete with color guard, pipe & drum band, choral group, and keynote speaker. Our Chapter Officers and Board voted to donate **\$300** on our behalf, and several members plan to attend to show our support. CHAPTER PRESIDENT'S CORNER

As we begin the New Year let us pause for a moment to reflect on past accomplishments as we prepare for the challenges of the coming year. In 2019 MOAA's advocacy efforts played a key role for the 2020 National Defense Authorization Act to include the repeal of the Widow's Tax, obtaining a military pay raise of 3.1%, a pause in DoD's plan to cut 18,000 medical billets, and military housing reform to include a "Tenant's Bill of Rights". These accomplishments were possible due to MOAA members' awareness and communication with their elected representatives. The goals for 2020 are equally challenging as they were in 2019. They include protection of health care benefits, keeping military pay and benefits strong, supporting military families, ending concurrent receipt penalties for all retirees, and improved DoD and VA services. Your support and engagement at the national and Chapter level is crucial for the realization of these goals. Thank you again to your commitment to "Never Stop Serving".

MOAA's leadership has identified the broad objectives listed below for 2020. Each objective has associated actions to protect or improve benefits and conditions of service. Stay current with calls to action by subscribing to the MOAA Newsletter online, and visiting the MOAA website at http://takeaction.moaa.org/?0

- 1. Ensure any changes to the Military Health System sustain military-medical readiness and beneficiary access to top-quality care.
- 2. Sustain military pay comparability with the private sector and block erosion of compensation and non-pay quality-of-life benefits.
- 3. Protect family support programs, and ensure military-provided services (housing, PCS, child care) are affordable, readily available, and meet quality standards.
- 4. End concurrent receipt penalties for military retirees.
- 5. Achieve equity of benefits, protections, and administrative support for Guard/Reserve members consistent with their active duty counterparts.

- 6. Ensure timely access to service-earned benefits, and resist proposals to erode foundational services delivered through the VA and DoD.
- 7. Support legislation, policies, and programs to enable the seven uniformed services to recruit, retain, and manage personnel.
