Jennifer and I attended the annual mid-year NYS Council meeting on April 28th, held this year in Utica. This was the first year in many that ALL of the chapters were represented.

Many topics were on the agenda; however one in particular discussion about "The Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunities for Military Children." The Senate and Assembly bills will be coming up for a vote soon in the state legislature. New York is on of only a few that has not passed legislation to allow the schools to "get-in-step" with the rest of the country with regard to our military children affected by state-unique requirements and impacting their status for graduation. Our council President, Lt Col Bob Bienvenue, has been working tirelessly with the federal committee to "pressure" our state to get in step.

President Obama elevated the national visibility on this issue in early 2011 in the administration's initiative called <u>Strengthening Our Military</u> <u>Families: Meeting America's Commitment.</u> One of the priorities in that program is to "ensure excellence in military children's education and their development". That requires the playing field be leveled for transfers into and out of schools in different states to deal with the issues children face during the many moves their military parent(s) make. The Compact is designed to do just that. Please take the time to write a short note to our local senators and assembly folks asking for their support for NYS Assembly Bill A2141 and Senate Bill 2538. Passage of this legislation is critical to the military children that are transferred into NYS during their school years.

This year's convention in Buffalo plans to be just as exciting as the one in 2005; with many activities and excellent accommodations at the Buffalo ANG base. Included in this newsletter are the details along with an application. The price is right and if you haven't been to one of our conventions, this would be an excellent one to attend!

Our last luncheon in April was well attended with over 40. Our guest speaker, Army COL Mark Migaleddi, Commander of the Watervliet Arsenal, was very informative. He provided our members with a powerful movie and power point presentation of the tremendous manufacturing capabilities of the arsenal and their contributions to all our war efforts since 1813.

"Military Health Care Protection Act of 2012" (S. 3203)

Senators Frank Lautenberg (D-NJ) and Marco Rubio (R-FL) introduced a bi-partisan bill, "Military Health Care Protection Act of 2012" (S. 3203), to stop unfair TRICARE fee hikes for military beneficiaries.

Key provisions of the bill:

- Acknowledgement that service members' service and sacrifice pre-pay healthcare premiums, over and above what they pay in cash
- Annual percentage increase in cash fees (including pharmacy copays, TRICARE Standard deductible, and the cap on annual out-of-pocket expenses) limited to the percentage increase in military retired pay

"We're grateful for Sen. Lautenberg's and Sen. Rubio's leadership in introducing this bill to protect uniformed services beneficiaries from disproportional TRICARE fee increases."

- No further increase in existing TRICARE Standard retiree inpatient copay of \$708 per day.
- Automatic enrollment in TRICARE Standard for any eligible beneficiary filing a claim until they opt to dis-enroll, if DOD should establish an enrollment system.

Let's urge our Senators to cosponsor this critical piece of legislation!
