#### "Grand Bargain?" Not for Military People (from the MOAA website)

In the afterglow/aftershock of the November elections (depending upon their political persuasion), administration and legislative leaders have signaled willingness to compromise (sort of) on a "grand bargain" to get the country back on a sound fiscal path.

The question is which chips are being bargained with. One indicator: the list of initiatives recently cited in a "<u>Meet the</u> <u>Press</u>" segment that were offered by the administration during last year's "grand bargain" discussions. In addition to changes to Medicare, Social Security and more, the list included \$27 billion in cuts over 10 years to military retirement and healthcare.

While the military community won't escape some cutbacks in this environment, it's important to get your oar in the water with a <u>MOAA-suggested message</u> to urge elected and appointed officials to oppose disproportional cutbacks on the military community that has "already given" in so many ways.

At the opening of the awards ceremony, Admiral Steve Abbott said; "This is our annual celebration of those who are true community heroes because they are taking care of our wounded and injured," he said, noting the importance of the evening. Keynote speaker James A. "Sandy" Winnefeld Jr., USN, vice chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, invoked the storm as he said, "Tonight, literally come hell or high water, you stand with those who have stood with us for decades, and your support is recognized."

Winnefeld presented his plan for not only ensuring wounded warriors get the care they need in hospitals and rehabilitation clinics but also making sure they — and all returning veterans — are successfully reintegrated into civilian life. He said key to veterans' success is that Americans hire these hard workers, prevent and reverse the trend of veteran homelessness, and continue to care for the wounds of war. "Yet even with all the outstanding work of these caregivers, our work is never complete," he said. "We need to take care of [veterans] and their seen and unseen wounds for decades to come." He noted this support and advocacy is where MOAA chapters nationwide especially are of service.

Ryan presented the night's awards to six groups and three individuals who are dedicated to helping wounded warriors:

- Individual award, civilian Edward and Elsie Smolarsky, Red Cross volunteers, 779th Aeromedical Staging Facility.
