# STORMING THE HILL - 2014

MOAA council and chapter presidents from across the nation, along with members of the national board of directors and headquarters staff, and members of MOAA's Currently Serving Advisory Council, Currently Serving Spouse Advisory Council, and Auxiliary Member Advisory Committee stormed Capitol Hill April 9. The "stormers" paid visits to nearly all 535 representatives and senators to discuss key military personnel issues that affect the well-being of the all-volunteer force and military families. MOAA stormers asked for legislative support to:

- sustain military pay and benefits;
- reject disproportional TRICARE fee increases that shift costs onto beneficiaries while reducing access;
- eliminate harmful sequestration cuts, which threaten national security; and
- address remaining inequities for disabled retirees, survivors, and recalled Guard and Reserve personnel.

Storming also included MOAA-sponsored full-page ads in The Hill and Politico newspapers. During the meetings, many legislators and staffers mentioned the 15,000 messages that MOAA members sent in support of the alert that MOAA issued prior to storming the Hill.

Col. Mike Hayden, USAF (Ret), MOAA Director of Government Relations, representing The Military Coalition, testified against the personnel and health care cuts in the FY 2015 budget before the House Armed Services Military Personnel Subcommittee. He argued against imposing "a disproportional share of this burden" on the military and military families.

Colonel Hayden pointed out that the FY 2014 and FY 2015 pay caps, the proposed reductions in Basic Allowance for Housing, the planned reductions in commissary savings, and new health care fees, would cut the purchasing power of an E-5's family of four by nearly \$5,000 per year; nearly \$6,000 per year for an O-3's family of four.

May 24, 2:00 pm - New York's Missing Link: The Sullivan-Clinton Campaign, Then and Now. Drawing on new research and using dramatic visuals, Robert Speigelman recounts the story of the 1779 Sullivan-Clinton Campaign against New York's Iroquois tribes and its far-reaching effects.

May 31, 2:00 pm - General Gordon Granger: The Savior of Chickamauga and the Man Behind Juneteenth. Author Robert C. Conner reviews the career of New York Major General Gordon Granger and his roles in the Battle of Chickamauga and the origin of Juneteenth, a holiday celebrating the emancipation of enslaved peoples in the United States.

June 7, 2:00 pm - <u>Battle of Saipan</u>. Lieutenant Colonel Paul Fanning (ret), an avid historian of the New York National Guard, details the harsh experiences of New York's 27th Division during this decisive battle of World War II's Central Pacific Campaign.
