Wreaths Across America[™] is 501(c) (3) corporation whose mission, according to their website is to **Remember, Honor, and Teach.** Their main effort involves "coordinating wreath laying ceremonies on a specified Saturday in December at Arlington, as well as veterans' cemeteries and other locations in all 50 states and beyond."



They also "organize a week of events including international veteran's tributes, ceremonies at State Houses and a week-long 'Veteran's Parade' between Maine and Virginia" where they spread their message about "the importance of remembering our fallen heroes, honoring those who serve, and teaching our children about the sacrifices made by veterans and their families to preserve our freedoms." Thousands of volunteers organize local ceremonies, raise funds to sponsor wreaths, and participate in the events. They "also coordinate veteran services and recognition through a variety of programs, and provide schools with teaching aides for projects throughout the year."

Wreaths Across America TM receives no funding from the government. Individual wreaths sponsors, corporate donors and volunteer truckers cover the cost of their programs.

Our chapter is a fundraising sponsor of Wreaths Across America. The deadline for wreaths purchased this year to be placed this year is Nov30.

If you would like to attend the ceremony and assist in placement of the wreaths, it starts at 1200 hrs. There are 12,000 graves. Last year there were only 2,200 wreaths.






ANNUAL MEETING & CHRISTMAS/HOLIDAY PARTY - DECEMBER 13!

OUR CHAPTER - 2015 4-STAR CHAPTER!!

The Scheibers and the Bebernitz's attended the Annual MOAA Convention in Orlando, FL, Oct 30-31.

Leaders and spouses from more than 140 councils and chapters, with members of MOAA national staff and board of directors attended the 2015 Levels of Excellence Award dinner. MOAA affiliates compete for four- or five-star Levels of Excellence Awards. The best councils and chapters receive five-star awards; above-average councils and chapters receive four-star awards. Chapter 1st VP, Skip Bebernitz (at right), accepted a MOAA Levels of Excellence *four-star* award for our Chapter presented by Charles T. Robertson, Gen USAF (Ret), the Chairman of the MOAA Board (at left in photo). *This is our Chapter's second four-star award!* Let's keep up the good work.



General Robertson highlighted the growth of MOAA to more than 390,000 members. He reviewed efforts of the Government Relations team to protect the earned benefits of the military, and praised the chapter and council system. "the heart and soul of what MOAA is about".

During the convention, Admiral Ryan reviewed "several recent changes, including the MOAA logo refresh, the redesigned website, and the new tagline 'Never Stop Serving'." He also talked about our legislative accomplishments, but warned that we face big challenges with continued pay and health care threats. Additionally, Admiral Ryan highlighted the litany of MOAA's member products and services, such as "the VA claims-assistance program, career transition services, caregiver support, the MOAA Scholarship Fund, the MOAA Military Family Initiative, and insurance products and offering."

Vice Adm. Sean Pybus, USN, deputy commander, U.S. Special Operations Command (SOCOM), gave a talk about the evolution of special operations into the future. Pybus highlighted current special operations in more than 80 countries, including Afghanistan, advising and assisting allies. "We think [Afghanistan] is an important place," he said. "We're optimistic about the plans we have in place." The anticipated timeline for SOCOM missions is 10 to 15 years. Fortunately, sequestration has had minimal effect on special operations compared to other military missions, but SOCOM isn't getting any bigger.

2015 NY COUNCIL OF CHAPTERS CONVENTION

The Council of Chapters officers hosted this year's convention in the gorgeous Genesee Grande Hotel in Syracuse, Oct 16-18. Attending from our Chapter were Ed and Jennifer Scheiber, Ron Neaton and Carol Akots, Al and Mary Memole, Rocco and Agnes Acquilano, and Tony Ficara.

Overall attendance was low, but the Council continues to support its chapters. Jim Carman, CAPT USN (Ret), Director of the MOAA Transition Center, gave a comprehensive presentation on MOAA at the business meeting and an inspiring talk at the dinner.


