OUR CHAPTER NEEDS YOU! Here's what you can do...

PUBLIC RELATIONS CHAIR

The Chapter needs someone – a member, an auxiliary, or a member spouse – who is imaginative, energetic, outgoing, but mostly willing and able to interact with local media – and even social media – on a regular basis to publicize Chapter contact information and events. People in the Capital District need to know who we are and what we do! *Might that person be you?*

TRANSITION ASSISTANCE CHAIR (a.k.a., Transition Liaison/Networking Coordinator)

Officers, active and reserve, are continually leaving military service and moving to or returning to the Capital District, often in search of a second career or at least transitional employment to get their feet on the ground. The Chapter needs someone – a member, an auxiliary, or a member spouse – who will step up to guide transitioning officers and help them research career options and make local professional connections. *Might that person be you?* Actually, we could use a small team of volunteers here.

Chapter Needs Continued

Don't worry that you are not up to the task! MOAA's Transition Assistance Program (TAP) has a wealth of resources that you can "tap" into: <u>The Marketing Yourself for a Second Career</u> presentation demonstrates ways to develop self-marking techniques, LinkedIn strategies, interview skills, and resumes, and negotiate salary and benefits. TAP offers benefits and financial advice for every stage of life. The MOAA Transition Center provides career transition webinars that are open to the extended military community (<u>http://www.moaa.org/NewMilRetirement/</u>). MOAA sponsors live and virtual career fairs and other events designed to facilitate real time professional networking. MOAA also promotes American Corporate Partners (ACP), a "nationwide non-profit that connects transitioning veterans with experienced professionals for one-one mentorships" with ACP career coaches (<u>http://www.acp-usa.org/</u>).

SURVIVING SPOUSE LIAISON

When military members pass away, their surviving spouses are overcome with grief and overwhelmed with various tasks and decisions they must make. They are the members of our community most in need. The Chapter needs someone – a member, an auxiliary, or even a member's spouse – willing and able to reach out to surviving spouses to comfort and assist, informing them of benefits, and letting them know that the Chapter and MOAA have not forgotten them. *Might that person be you?*

PROGRAM COMMITTEE CHAIR

This important position is like being the Ops Officer of the Chapter. We need an energetic person who will lead a small team to plan and coordinate the Chapter's program of activities, primarily, our meetings. The Program Committee handles guest speakers, dinner reservations, and meeting logistics. *Might that person be you?*


