- 10. Assure timely access to the VA, and eliminate the VA claims backlog.

A MESSAGE FROM THE CHAPTER PRESIDENT

It is my sincerest hope that this message finds all of you well! This truly was a great winter, unless you enjoy winter sports.

Our earned benefits will continue to be under attack. Many lawmakers will find it preferable to take money away from the DOD *and us* to fund social programs in an election year. DOD will be interested in sustaining weapons and equipment programs over personal benefits.

There have many times in the past where there has been a shortage of funding for the needs of the Armed Services or for veterans. One such period was after the Civil War that led in part to the birth of the Grand Army of the Republic that fought to attain and retain pensions for veterans. There was the Pension Riots in the 1930's. There was such a lack of funding for the Armed Services that broomsticks replicated rifles in training. In his book "Beyond the Band of Brothers", Major Dick Winters wrote that when they jumped into Normandy before D-Day, one of his troops spotted a German sniper. The troop aimed his rifle and yelled "BANG, BANG" from muscle memory! The sniper then shot and killed that soldier.

CHANGES TO THE CHAPTER CONSTITUTION and BY LAWS

Proposed changes to the Constitution and By Laws, 30 January 2016

Constitution:

Article III Membership:

Section 2.2. "Auxiliary members" shall be changed to "Surviving Spouses" and all subsequent references shall also be changed.

Section 3. "Retired Officer Community" shall be changed to the "Military Officer Community".

Section 5. Shall be changed to "Membership shall not be denied based on: Race/Ethnicity, Color, National Origin, Sex, Disability, Age, Citizenship Status, Genetic Information, Marital Status, Sexual Orientation, Political Activities, Use of Service Dogs or any other protected Class as defined by United States Law or the Law of the State of New York."

Article VII. Shall be changed to read "The reading of proposed amendment(s) or a new Constitution is made by the Board of Directors at a given Chapter meeting and posted on the Chapter website. It is tabled until the following Chapter meeting whereupon the Board of Directors presents its recommendation(s) as to the merit. The amendment(s) or new Constitution are voted upon and must be adopted by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present."

By Laws:

Article IV Officers: Section 2. Change to "Elections shall be held in even numbered years."

Article V Committees.

The following committees shall be added: "Transition Assistance Program, Community Action, and Surviving Spouse".

Article VI Amendments

Section 1. Shall be changed to read "These By Laws may be amended or repealed in whole or in part by a majority vote at any organized meeting of the Chapter, provided that a copy of the amendment(s) proposed for amendment has been read at a meeting and posted for 15 days at the Chapter's website at least 15 days before the meeting at which the vote is to be taken."


