And, having mentioned our nearest National Cemetery above, we segue to one of our important annual charities: Wreaths Across America<sup>TM</sup> (WAA), a 501(c)(3) corporation whose mission is to **Remember, Honor, and Teach** Americans of all ages about the sacrifices made by those who served our nation

in her Armed Forces. We can support this worthy cause in two ways:

 SPONSOR WREATHS. Please ask your families, friends, local organizations and businesses to sponsor wreaths through our Chapter. The cost to sponsor a single wreath is \$15. Donors may sponsor one or more wreaths by mailing a check along with the form on pg.10 of this newsletter to WAA at their Maine address, or, through the WAA website at https://www.wreathsacrossamerica.org/ following the instructions on pg.11 of this newsletter,. Our Chapter's WAA group code is NY0087P. Wreaths sponsored through us are designated for placement at – you guessed it – the Gerald B. H. Solomon Saratoga National Cemetery, located at 200 Duell Rd, Schuylerville, NY. For each wreath sponsored through our Chapter, WAA returns \$5 to us. We turn this revenue back to the community by donating to other worthy local charities benefitting the community, local veterans, and historical and military-related organizations.

- ➤ 4,955 wreaths have been sponsored as of September 20, representing 32.8% of the total number needed. We need <u>10,145</u> more wreaths before December's wreath laying event.
- 2. LAY WREATHS ON VETERANS' GRAVES. There are **15,100 veteran graves** at the Saratoga National Cemetery. *Volunteers* from our local community lay all these wreaths, pausing after placing each wreath to salute and remember the veteran, saying his or her name. *We encourage all of you to attend the ceremony and help place wreaths if you are able.* This year's wreath laying event at Saratoga will be held on **Saturday**, <u>December 17</u>, with a solemn ceremony **beginning at 12:00 noon** prior to laying wreaths. Those among us who have participated in the past can attest that this is a valuable and moving experience.

#### • **LEGISLATIVE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE REPORT** (Submitted by Pat Piccirilli and the Chapter's Legislative Affairs Committee)

### CHECK UP ON YOUR LEGISLATOR

How can I confirm that my Congressional legislator is supporting MOAA backed legislation?

This task is not that complicated thanks to the website congress.gov. You don't need an account to sign in although you can create an account for yourself. The key is using the search bar at the top of the page (the extreme right side of the bar shows a magnifying glass). In the left column select "Current Congress" and in the next column type in the bill designation which MOAA normally provides (check out the <u>MOAA Legislative Action Center</u>). For example the Stop CoPay Overpay Act designation is H.R. 4824. The H.R. means that it originated in the House of Representatives. A bill that originates in the Senate uses the letter S.

Click on the magnifying glass symbol and it brings up the information on that bill. You'll see the word "cosponsors" usually with a number after it in parentheses; the number denotes the number of legislators who have cosponsored that bill. Click on the number and it will propagate a list of all the legislators who cosponsored the bill. Once on the results page click on New York State which will list all the New York state Congressional legislators who cosponsored the bill.

Note: At this point in time our Current Congress is 117th (2021-2022)

Here is one example where your call, email or letter can make a difference:

Please support expanding concurrent receipt. In the House concurrent receipt legislation, the "**Major Richard Starr Act**" (**H.R. 1282**) currently has 290 co-sponsors. House rules allow a member of Congress to file a motion with the House Clerk to place their legislation on the Consensus Calendar once their legislation has accumulated 290 cosponsors. If the legislation maintains at least 290 cosponsors for 25 legislative days, and the committee of jurisdiction does *not* report the legislation to the House floor, it will be placed on the Consensus Calendar allowing House Speaker Nancy Pelosi to bring legislation to the House floor for a vote. Retired pay is for years of arduous military service paid by the Department of Defense, while disability pay is for lifelong injury paid by the VA. To reduce retirement pay because of a disability is an injustice. **Please contact your legislative representative and ask that they support H.R. 1282**. (*Thanks to Kathy Gates and Skip Bebernitz for this information*)

Ed & Jennifer Scheiber hosted the most recent meeting of our Chapter Board of Directors at their beautiful lakeside residence just north of Diamond Point on Lake George. A tasty potluck picnic followed the very 1-o-o-o-ng meeting. Here are some of the key take-aways from the meeting:

- MEMBERSHIP: Chapter membership has dropped below 100 members. We are now at 90 or 91 members, including surviving spouses. We resolved to make recruitment and retention of members a top priority. [As members, YOU are all recruiters. If you know people who are or should be MOAA members and not part of our Chapter, please invite them to join us, or give them a Chapter membership application, which you can download here: <u>Chapter Membership Application Form</u>]
- VACANT COMMITTEE POSITIONS. We still have five roles that we'd like to fill. We decided <u>not</u> to make a special effort to seek candidates at this time. However, if YOU would like to support our Chapter more actively by doing ONE task, consider one of these positions:
  - Surviving Spouse Liaison (coordinates support, as needed)
  - Personal Affairs (reports member deaths; identify members' various needs)
  - Public Relations (raises Chapter visibility in the community via local publicity)
  - Transition Assistance Program (provides guidance & assistance to members and prospective members leaving military service or moving to our area)
  - Historian (creates and maintains a chronology of all we do)
- VACANT BOARD POSITIONS. We have two vacant positions. If filled, they would add depth and breadth of perspective to the Board, but we opted to wait until the next election in December 2023 to fill them – unless YOU are interested.
- NYS COUNCIL OF CHAPTERS CONVENTION PROGRAM AD. The Board voted to expend \$100 from the Treasury to buy a full page ad in the Convention's program, to congratulate the Council on its 50<sup>th</sup> consecutive convention and support the convention financially.
- OUR CHAPTER'S 50<sup>TH</sup> YEAR. We will recognize our own 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary at our Annual Business Meeting in December.

By all accounts the 50<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting of the New York State Council of Chapters held 11 – 15 September, 2022, at the Riveredge Resort Hotel, Alexandria Bay, NY, was a **resounding success!** (*Huge thanks to Lt Col Norma Weissend, Council VP, the organizer!*) The resort was *very* nice, situated in one of our State's most beautiful locales. We had around 50 attendees, varying by day and event, including reps from MOAA headquarters, the *Massachusetts* Council of Chapters, and *Oklahoma*! This convention, like its 49 predecessors, had two major components: MOAA Business and Social (FUN).



#### 1. Business Highlights:

a. MOAA NATIONAL. The Council was honored by the presence of four key members from MOAA national headquarters. On Monday, 9/12, MOAA Staff Members presented seminars on key three key topics. 



Solomon National Cemetery, Schuylerville" will appear below, to confirm you have the correct fundraising organization. *Select the number of wreaths you wish to sponsor*, and click on the red "Review of Sponsorships" button to be able to complete the transaction.
